### **Matters Arising:**

Cllr. T. O’ Flaherty referred to page 11, point 9, in relation to a request for an update on the toilets & shelter in Ballyloughane and to her recent motion submitted in relation to this matter (NOM 38/2023) and asked if her motion could be taken.

Cllr. N. McNelis referred to bed tax letter issued to the CCMA and asked for an update on this. He also queried if the Council have received the rates limitation order.

Cllr. Lyons asked if any notes were taken of the meeting with the OPR and the executive and are they available.

Cllr. M. Cubbard referred to serious anti-social behaviour issues in Galway City and the circulation of same on social media and proposed that the executive write to the Chief Superintendent to request a meeting with the Elected Members to discuss this issue.

The Chair invited a response from the executive on the above.

In response to the Rates Limitation Order, Ms. H. Kilroy informed members that she hopes to receive same within the next few days.

In response to the Bed Tax letter to the CCMA, Ms. P. Philbin informed members that she is due to meet with the CCMA this week and will follow up on this matter.

In response to the OPR/Executive meeting, Mr. U. Finn informed members that it was an informal meeting and there are no notes or minutes available.

Further clarifications were raised:

- Who attended the OPR/Executive meeting and what was the subject of the meeting.

In relation to anti-social behaviour issues in Galway City, Cllr. Cubbard proposed that the Chief Executive contact the Gardai/Chief Superintendent to meet with Elected Members to discuss these issues. This was seconded by Cllr. F. Fahy and agreed.

The Chair invited a response from the executive on the above.

In response to the OPR/Executive meeting, Mr. U. Finn informed members that he had previously spoken to Cllr. D. McDonnell in relation to this issue and thought that they had clarity on this matter and added that he will write to Mr. Niall Cussens, OPR, to get clarity on this issue.

In relation to the issue of anti-social behaviour in the City and the request to meet with the Chief Superintendent, Cllr. D. Lyons referred to the upcoming JPC Public Meeting which is taking place on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> November 2023. He stated that questions on this issue can be raised at this meeting and asked if all members could attend same.

**NOM 38/2023**

**Submitted by Cllr. T. O’Flaherty on the 6th November 2023**

I call on the City Council to install the much needed Changing Shelter for Ballyloughane with immediate effect. The funding of €40,000 for the shelter was included in the 2021 City Council budget and so far in has not been installed despite the fact that there’s no shelter in Ballyloughane.

The Chair invited members of the Executive to give an update on Storm Debi.

Ms. P. Philbin, Ms. F. Holland and Mr. M. Cormican gave a detailed update on the aftermath of the storm which included images of flooding and damage caused throughout Galway City.

Ms. F. Holland informed Members that the Local Coordination Committee will be meeting again later this evening for further updates.

The Chair thanked the Executive for the update. He also complimented and thanked the Coordination team, and all involved for their work during the storm.

The Chair invited comments.

The following comments/queries were raised:

- How were rough sleepers dealt with during the Storm, was accommodation provided?
- Number of businesses/homes damaged.
- Was there any damage done in Mutton Island.
- Have Galway City Council a data base of all residents/Companies so that car owners can be contacted to move cars in areas prone to flooding.
- Why did people not get more advance notice nationally of the Storm.
- Can Black Rock Tower be fixed as soon as possible or else erect substantial blocks on it to stop it being used until repairs are carried out.
- Flooding on Bóthar Na dTreabh – why did this happen?

- Can members get a timeline of when flood defences will be built on Spanish Arch, Salt hill and other areas prone to flooding in the City.
- How do residents/businesses affected by Storm damage and flooding apply for funding.
- Ash die-back - Can a plan be put in place to remove these trees.
- Need to work with Uisce Eireann and put together a proper gully maintenance plan.
- Update on flood defence and drawing down the funding.
- Some houses in the Claddagh area received money from the LIS funding to erect flood defences and these properties did not flood this time. Can the Council look at this for other areas.
- Can we apply for funding for damaged playgrounds.
- Have we access to a volunteer base we can utilise in events like this to alleviate pressure on City Council staff.

Ms. F. Holland, Mr. M. Cormican and Ms. E. Fanning replied to the above queries.

Ms. P. Philbin informed members that applications for funding have been circulated to members.

In relation to the Catchment Flood Risk Assessment and Management (CFRAMs), Mr. U. Finn informed members that a follow up presentation can be arranged.

Mr. B. Barrett added that the Draft Climate Action Plan will be going out to Public Consultation shortly and this will include mitigation against climate change.

The Chair proposed to deal with agenda items 7, 9 & 10 and invited comments.
