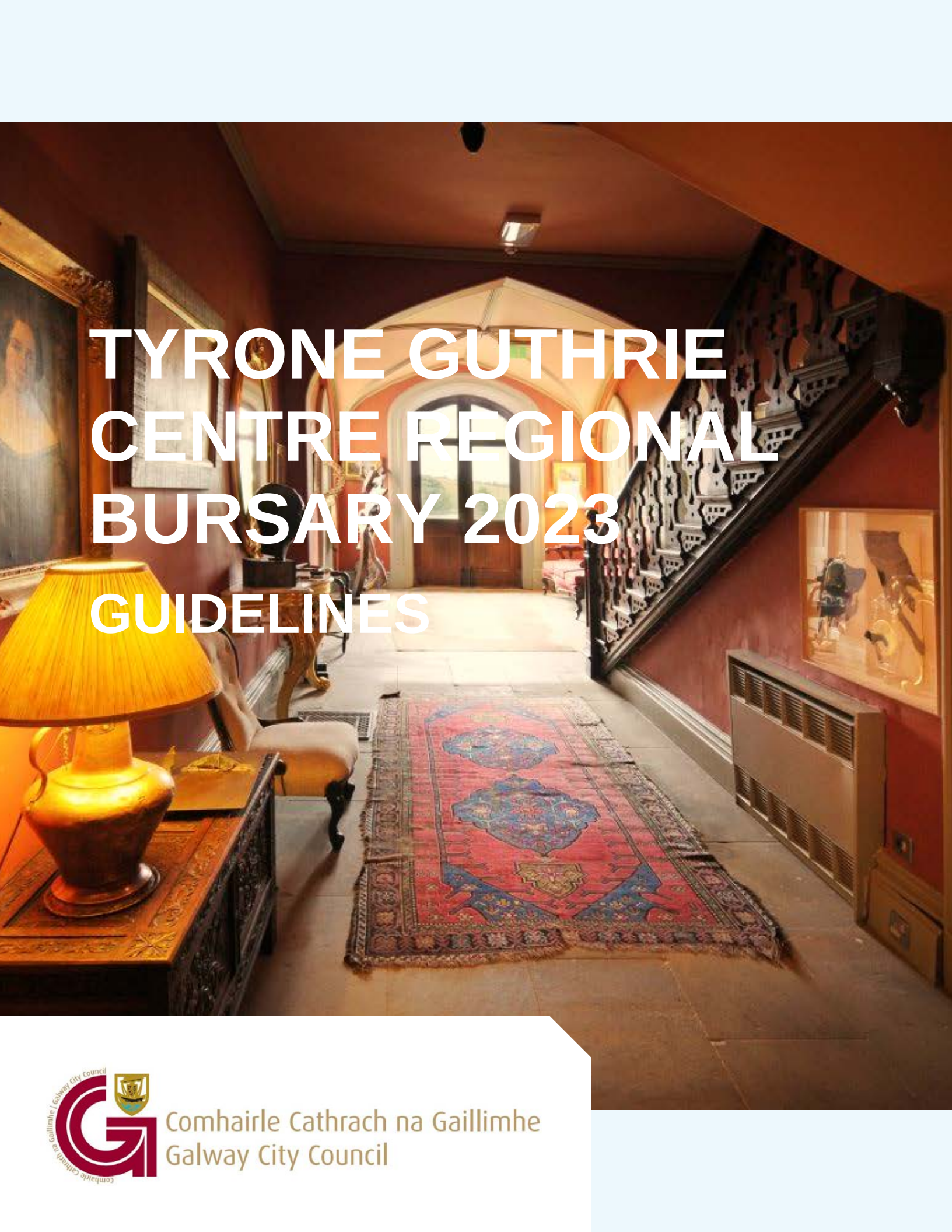

TYRONE GUTHRIE CENTRE REGIONAL BURSARY 2023 GUIDELINES

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Introduction

Application Deadline 20.04.23

Over 27 local authorities across the Island of Ireland offer bursaries which enable artists to spend two weeks at the Tyrone Guthrie Centre. Each bursary covers all board and lodging expenses, plus the use of a studio if required. The Galway City Council Arts Office is delighted to offer this opportunity to two artists living in Galway City. Further details about The Tyrone Guthrie Centre can be found at www.tyroneguthrie.ie

What are the aims and objectives of the bursary?

- (i) To support a diverse range of artists in accessing quality time and space to invest in their personal, professional and art practices.
- (ii) To support artists in sharing their work with the communities from which they come, through exhibitions, performances, readings, and other public outcomes.
- (iii) Strengthen the Tyrone Guthrie Centre's partnerships with local authorities and act as a major cross-border collaboration between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

Who is eligible for the Bursary?

- (i) Individual Creative Practitioners working in the following disciplines:

Architecture	Sound Art
Community Arts	Theatre
Circus	Traditional Arts
Digital arts	Multi-disciplinary
Dance	Music
Festival	Opera
Film & Video	Visual Art
Literature	

- (i) This bursary is only open to those living in Galway City Council's administrative area. If you live in Galway County the Galway County Council Arts Office hosts similar schemes for which you are eligible.
- (ii) Applicants over the age of 21.

Criteria

A	Artistic Quality and Ambition - The quality of your work and work methodology - Evidence you are working towards an exhibition, publication or performances for which a stay at the Centre would represent a core support	25%
B	Quality of Work Examples and Arts Background - Consideration of your background and a proven track record in the arts - Evidence of significant achievement in your chosen field or a high degree of potential	25%
C	Potential Impact on Individual's Artistic Development - Whether this work will have a constructive and positive effect on your artistic practice/career	25%
D	Feasibility - Clarity of your proposal and what you want to achieve as a result of your time in the Tyrone Guthrie Centre - Your capacity to complete and see this work through to successful fruition	25%

Assessment

All applications will be considered by an Arts Advisory Committee, appointed by Galway City Council. The Arts Advisory Committee will review your application and score it based on how successfully it meets the criteria outlined above. These scores will be aggregated and an order of merit list generated. While the order of the merit list will play a significant part in funding decisions, it is not the only factor. The Assessment process will take account of the spectrum of media, practices, and potential for artistic development across all applicants. The Arts Advisory Committee will also record feedback for each application which applicants may request.

Completing Your Application

- Remember that several people will be involved in the decision-making so make your application clear, concise and unambiguous.
- Do not assume the selection panel knows you or your work – treat each application as if it were your first.
- Remember your application is assessed on the basis of all information supplied within the competitive context of many other applications.

Each application must be accompanied by:

- Proof of Address
- A C.V – no more than 2 pages
- A sample of your work which may include - images, text, compositions, audio and/or video.

Submitting Your Application

A formal acknowledgment of your application with a reference number will be issued within two weeks of submission. If you do not receive this communication within that time, it is your responsibility to contact the Arts Office in this regard. You must ensure that all requested documentation is attached to your application form online. Your application will be invalid if you do not:

- Submit a fully completed online application form
- Submit all requested documentation with your application form (additional documentation cannot be accepted after the closing date)
- Submit your application by the deadline of 20.04 2023.

Note –

Canvassing will disqualify the applicant. Each application is assessed solely on the content of that application. Prior contact with the arts office in this regard will not advantage your application.

Conditions for Successful Applicants

- The residency must take place in 2023

- Galway City Council must be acknowledged on all publicity, press and marketing material produced in connection with the residency and any artistic outcomes in line with our Acknowledgement Guidelines, [here](#).
- If the project is altered, postponed or cancelled – in whole or in part – the Arts Office must be contacted in order to discuss the matter.
- A written account of the residency experience, including its impact on the artist's practice, must be submitted to the Arts Office within 2 weeks of the residency.

Freedom of Information

You are welcome to ask for feedback as to why your application was not successful. Availing of this is highly recommended as it may help you develop applications for further bursaries. Details of successful applicants will be published on our website and social media channels.

Galway City Council undertakes to hold confidential any information provided by applicants subject to its obligations under law, including the Freedom of Information Act 2014. Applicants are requested to consider if any of the information supplied should not be disclosed because of its sensitivity. If this is the case, candidates should, when providing the information, identify same and specify the reasons for its sensitivity. If such information is not identified as sensitive and Galway City Council upon consideration does not deem it sensitive, then such information is liable to be released in response to a Freedom of Information request without further consultation with the applicants. Galway City Council will consult with any candidates about sensitive information before making a decision on any Freedom of Information Act request received.
