Dear Sir / Madam,

I have lived in Woodquay all of my life. This park means a lot to me and my family. The planning for the small park outside my house is not suitable for this community in the inner city of Galway. As an electrician working in the building industry building housing estates, it is fine to have a green park with no railings. This is because the park is for that community and there are not 8 bars next to them as is the case in Woodquay. On a housing estate it is rare to have the kind of anti social behaviour that we see in the city. My house is only meters from the entrance to this park and since the council have stopped locking the gates at night the anti social behaviour has gotten steadily worse. If this plan goes ahead, we will be over run with the problems the Eyre Square has. The guards will not be able to manage this. I do not want to see the railings being taken down. It will be the end to this park. I could not get to the open day because I was working. But I have seen the plan and it is not suitable for Woodquay on any level. Two schools use it all the time. How can they use it if the railings are gone.

I ask An Bord Pleanala to refuse this planning permission for this project.
